Alliance Membership Fees for 2021

The new ranked category model, that was presented in the last newsletter, has now been approved by all three sector Associations at their respective annual general meetings and will be implemented by January 1st, 2021, at the latest.

We accept a number of payment methods (credit, cheque, cash) and hope to have an online payment option, with automatic annual renewal, available soon.

The membership fee category is based upon your **gross sales** (farm gate value, **NOT** processed and marketed) and will be applied uniformly to all grower members, mussel, oyster, and finfish.

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2020 Shoreline Clean-Up Activities

After consulting with the PEI Aquaculture Alliance Board, we have decided to cancel the Annual Shoreline Cleanup event for this year, the current public health restrictions make it impractical to organise any coordinated group activities. However, we have all the necessary permits for **individual growers** to go out and clean the various bays and estuaries throughout the province where aquaculture is practised.

Anyone going out to clean-up a near-by area of shoreline is encouraged to follow all the Public Health Guidelines regarding social distancing and personal hygiene, go to <u>www.princeedwardisland.ca/covid19</u> for up-to-date information.

<u>Alliance members</u> are encouraged to lead this effort in the estuaries where they are active and to inform the Alliance about their activities to avoid duplication of effort.

Island Waste Management Corporation (IWMC) has generously agreed to waive disposal fees for material collected and have just announced that their drop off sites are once again open to accept waste materials. Please follow all IWMC rules and guidelines regarding their restricted operations (<u>IWMC Notice</u>) and please be aware that this may change at short notice due to updates from Public Health.

Important - Please Take Note: There have always been certain shoreline areas that must be avoided at this time of year due to nesting shorebirds, especially the Piping Plover. Once again, a condition of our Activity Permit (which we get for vehicle access for our shoreline clean-ups) that we contact the Island Nature Trust **before** we do any shoreline clean-up, **even ones not involving vehicles**.

If you are organising a Shoreline Clean-Up, please contact Peter Warris (rd@aquaculturepei.com) or Denna Keating (peiaqua@aquaculturepei.com) at the Alliance office (902-368-2757) to check on your intended area of activity <u>before you</u> <u>undertake any activity!</u> We can then issue you copies of our shoreline and trail permits for vehicle access.

Throughout the year other groups, organizations, and individuals may be organising their own shoreline cleanup activities. These efforts should be communicated to the Alliance and supported by any leaseholders in their area.

Finally, if you are aware of or told about, an area that needs cleaning up, please let us know!

Finfish Growers

Once again, the Finfish Growers Association AGM was held at the PEIDFC Boardroom in Montague. Many thanks to all the provincial and federal government staff and UPEI staff who attended. Minister Fox was able to join us for lunch and discuss the industry and various issues with our grower members. Topics included the recent federal Liberal election platform announcements regarding net pen salmon farming in BC, the ongoing development of provincial regulations for land-based finfish farming, rural high speed internet access and its impact on businesses and changes to the testing regime for the Certificate of Fish Health.



Island Oyster Growers Group (IOGG)

The IOGG AGM was held at the Mill River Resort immediately following the end of the Oyster Business Conference. Jarrod Gunn McQuillan and Joanne Bowers (DFC) reviewed the results of 2019 Oyster Monitoring Program, Growth Trials and Shellfish Health Monitoring, and consulted with the membership on possible program changes. Dr. Jean MacLean (CFIA) reviewed the NAAHP monitoring for MSX, once again PEI is currently MSX free.

Cultured Mussel Growers Association (CMGA)

The CMGA AGM was held at the Farm Centre again this year. Policy Intel gave an update on the Team Seafood program which aquaculture farms, as well as processors, can now access (see page 14 and 15 for more details). There were presentations on the review and update of the PEI Aquaculture OH&S Codes of Practice, current Transport Canada requirements for the industry, opportunities for training and safety inspection for hydraulic equipment and the current PEI Immigration Program.

Since the program first started it has approved 64 equipment projects, 11 purchases of insulated containers, one farm management software installation and four training courses. An estimated **total of over \$3.1 million** (including industry contribution).
